The Museum is one of eight in SA that are 'Accredited' in the Museums and Collections program of the History Trust of South Australia. Our second five year review was due in 2023. This involved the Committee reviewing and updating our policies and procedures. After submitting this and documentation describing our operations and successes, we undertook an on-site assessment in December. We await the formal result of this effort.

NTSA Service Awards


As a Branch of the National Trust of South Australia (NTSA) we can nominate volunteers for the annual NTSA awards.
